



## Perspectives, Pros, Cons and Questions

Students to identify key stakeholders involved in the solution and identify the pros, cons and any questions that may come to mind from their perspective.

This is an example of an extended PMI chart. Students record the positives, minuses and implications or interesting facts. Students critique ideas individually or together to form an opinion or make a decision. In this version, there is an additional column header called 'Perspectives' (or Points of View) to challenge the students to think more critically about the topic being explored.
